

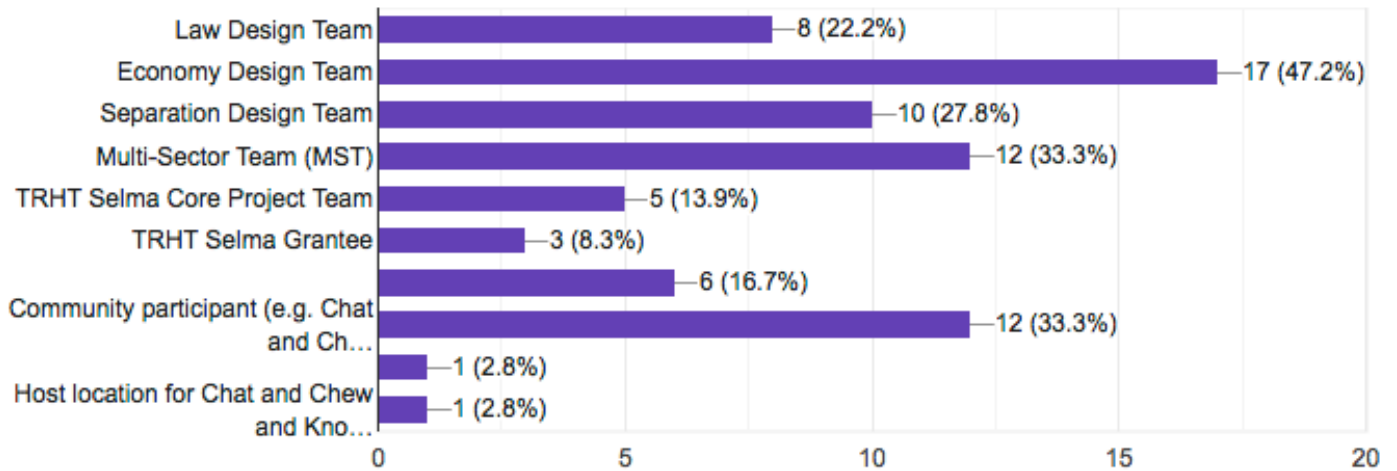

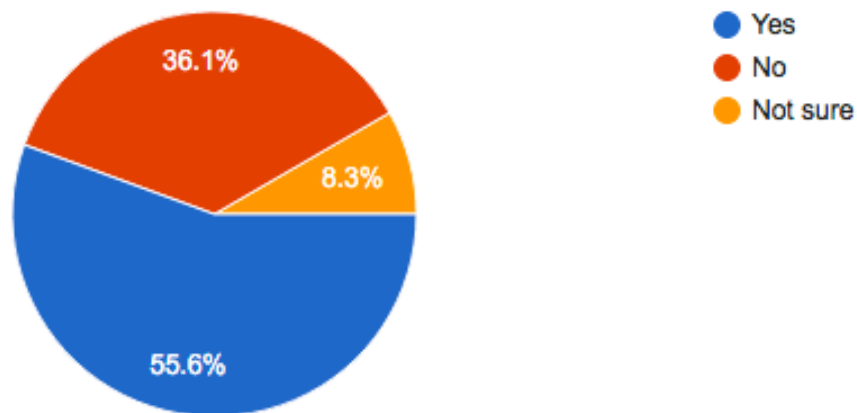
1. What aspects of the TRHT Selma Project are you (or have you been) involved with? (Please check all that apply)

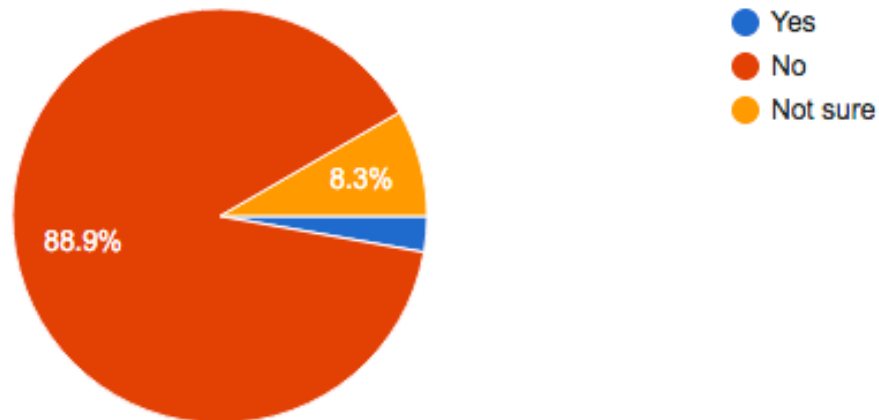

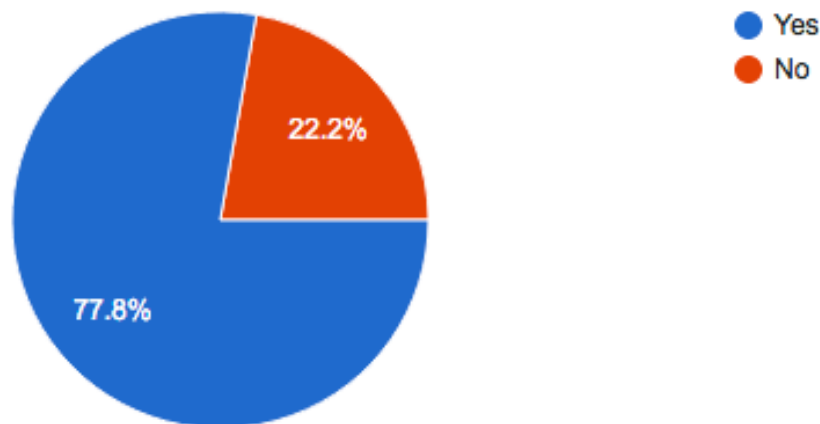
3. Does anyone in your household, including yourself, show symptoms of COVID-19 infection? For example, fever, tiredness, dry cough.

Wearing mask and abiding by CDC guidelines

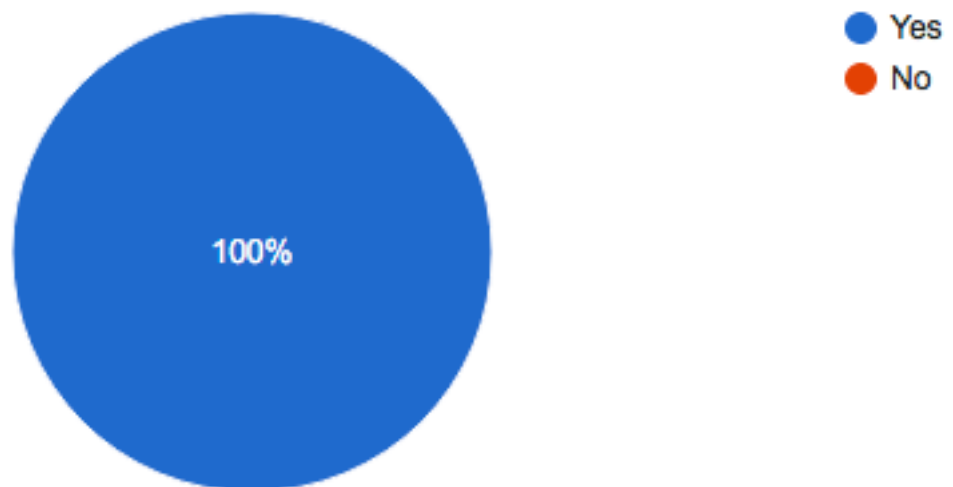

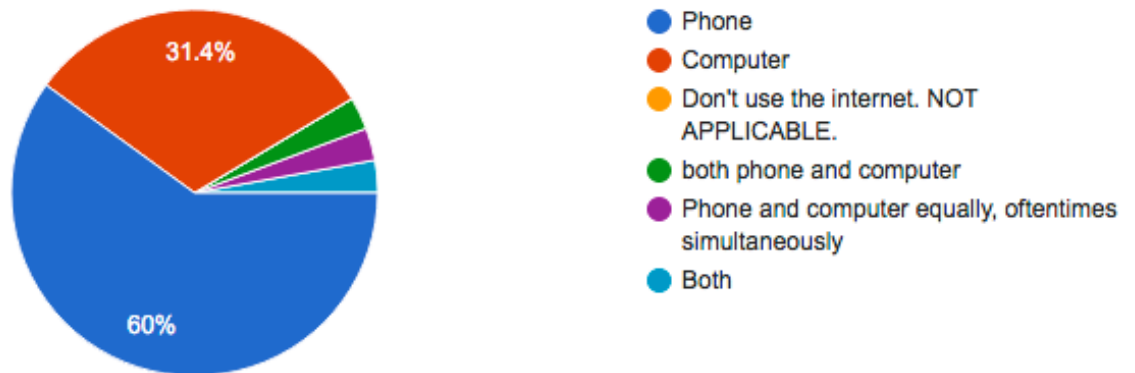
6. Do you have access to the internet?

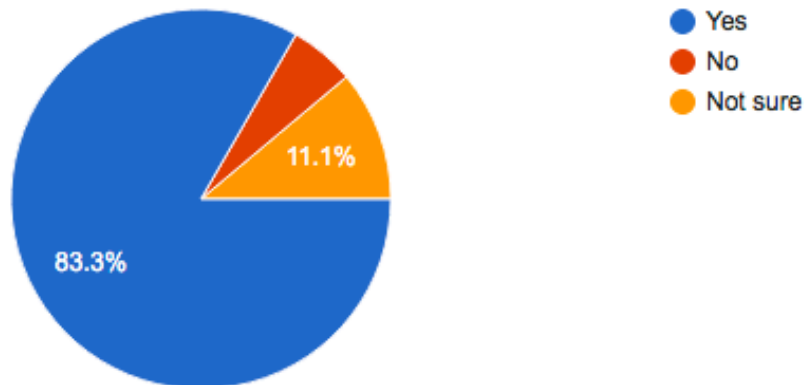
7. If so, do you use your phone or computer to access the internet primarily?

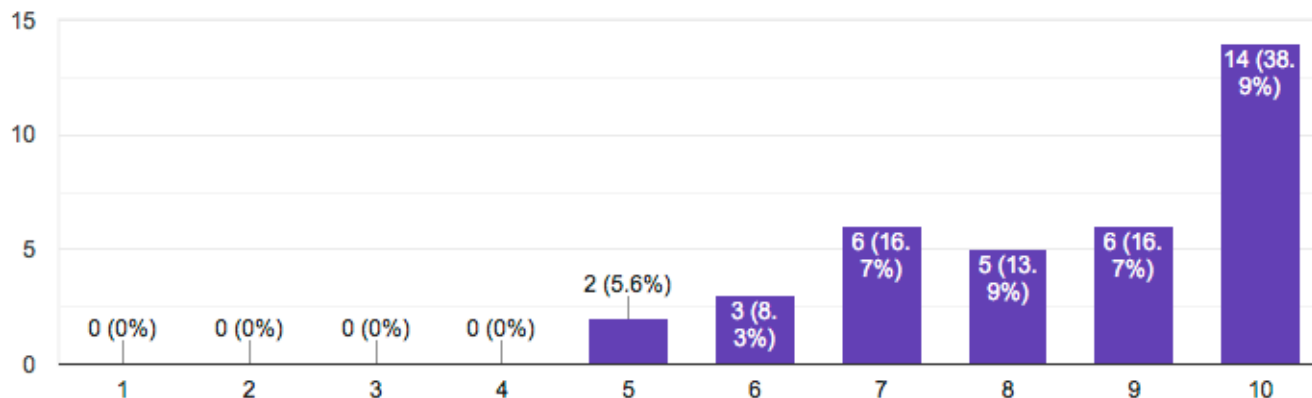

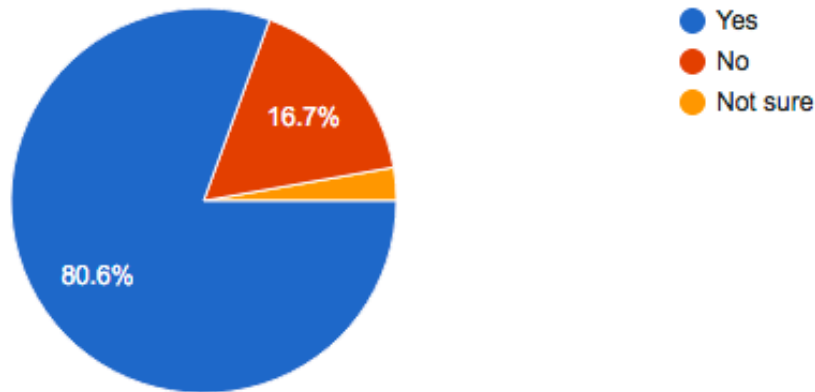

Keep the community updated on resources and any new developments.

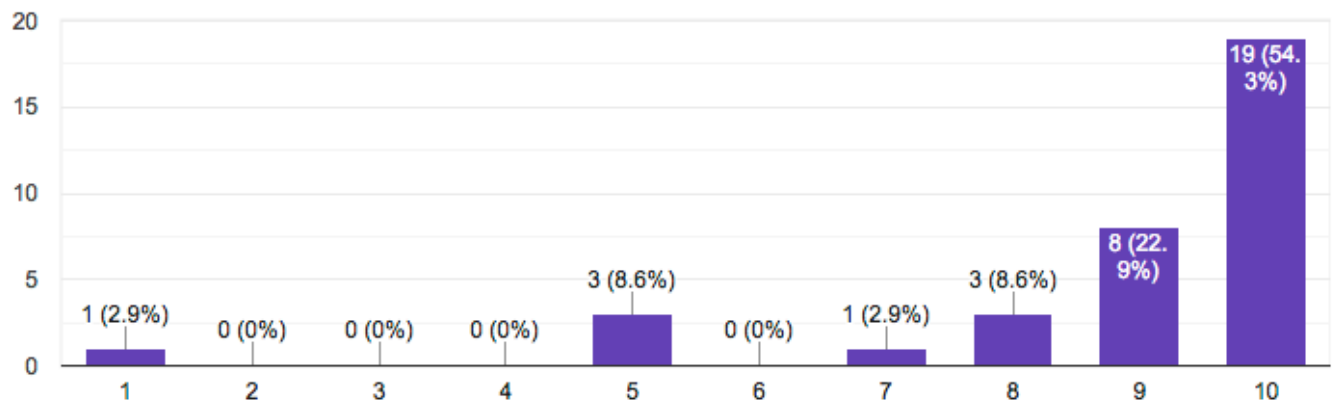
