DS: What are the most memorable years of your life and what happened to make them so memorable?

George Noory: The most memorable days of my life continue to be the next day beyond. To me every day is a gift, and I wish I had. DS: What are the must-haves in your daily wardrobe?

George Noory: In my wardrobe, I'm pretty casual and very comfortable. My day to day work outfit is a blue shirt or white and jeans because I'm doing radio. When I'm on the radio, I'll wear a suit and tie, but I'll wear a suit and tie when I'm on the radio. I'm doing a speaking engagement or book signing, it's either a suit without a tie or a suit over jeans, and then on weekends, I try to be as casual as I can. All that being said, I would not be one to be knocking on the cover of GQ!

DS: Who do people tell you you look like?

George Noory: Saddam Hussein! I've had this moustache since my early twenties, and it's become something of a trademark for me. I've asked many women that I have dated in my life (maybe a little more than Henry Kissinger by the way), and they say I look great on me. Just of late a Tom Selleck look going on. I am hoping someone in Hollywood does the Saddam Hussein story so maybe I can audition for it.

DS: How did you end-up being a Radio Broadcaster and Host of "Coast to Coast AM"?

George Noory: Family. At KABC - St. Louis, my boss often said "Get out of the UFO stuff. There's no future in it!" Later, at KTRB - St. Louis during my marriage when I used to get radio calls and my show had replaced Art Bell's "Coast to Coast AM" there. Eventually, my ratings soared, and the network asked me to be the host. When he was away or sick, which I would do after traveling my show. By 2003 (after retirement), I became full time host. I was always interested in radio as a kid and had some early professional experience and I'm encouraging my son to be a radio host. My best friend and I would launch model occasions in the neighborhood. I would do the radio broadcast in college at 18 - my first gig at KATZ. I was 18 in for a friend so that he could go home for Christmas. At 21, I got a job as a radio reporter. My first interview was Senator Friedman, legendary UFO expert and 1st civilian investigator of the Roswell incident. I still interview him regularly.

DS: Can you tell us more about your job?

George Noory: This program is like the tip of the iceberg. What the listener hears is the tip, it's very different from what goes on "under the water." I am responsible for not only the show direction but also working with our affiliate staff to grow the show (500 stations now in North America). I work with the sales staff for commercials and with our digital department. We stream live to a lot of people who buy an inexpensive subscription to podcast/download the show. I work with our producers and engineering staff on a daily basis. We've assembled a great team, and the job is much more than just the host. I'm here on the air at night - all the stuff is done during the day before then. For example, I've been in my office today since 7am in meetings, a necessary part of the show. I start preparing when I wake up. My producers and I select the guests a week or two in advance. We produce the 1st four hour day for morning news etc. A lot has gone on before we even get on the air.
